The concept envisions six-4 foot long grey granite benches with engraved backs placed along the walkways in the Memorial Garden at the National Museum of the United States Army (NMUSA).

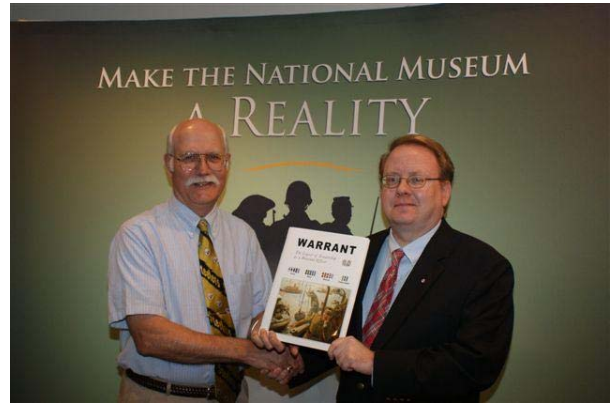


The other benches would be engraved for: “KOREA”, “VIETNAM”, “PANAMA - SOMALIA – HAITI”, “PERSIAN GULF” and “GLOBAL WAR ON TERROR”.

The concept is subject to approval and/or modification by the Army and Army Historical Foundation.

Warrant Officers Heritage Foundation 100th Birthday Historical Exhibit

July 9, 2018 is the 100th Birthday of the establishment of the Army Warrant Officer Corps in the Mine Planter Service of the Coast Artillery.

Estimated funding requirement of \$100,000 includes design, construction, placement, removal and possibly storage of the exhibit.

Eight years to meet goal assumes that contractor will accept a down payment with balance due on delivery & that pledges are redeemed in a timely manner.

Potential donation & pledge sources include: USAWOA, its Regions, Chapters, members, non-member warrant officers, Defense Contractors, other military related associations/organizations.

Just imagine

A possible \$60K from Chapters based on some 80 Chapters on the rolls. A possible \$48K from members is based on over 6,000 members on the rolls. We will also solicit support from non-member Warrant Officers, government contractors, and Warrant Officer friendly Corporations.
